She began private piano lessons at 8 years old and soon became the accompanist for the Sunday School classes. At the age of 13, her family transferred membership to Simeon's Church in Gratz where Carol was active in Luther League, always spending time at the piano, playing & singing with friends. Carol continued private lessons and began learning organ instrumentation and pedaling. She became one of the two Church Organists when she was 16 years old. She played on a bi-weekly schedule, serving Simeon's for many years. Carol eventually took the role of Choir Director, playing for services as needed. She served Simeon's for over 40+ years between the two roles.

Throughout the years Carol has accompanied several groups for special occasions in the community, served as Organist/Pianist for numerous weddings, and was active in leading music for VBS for several years. She is currently a member of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Millersburg and substitutes for Sunday Services about 4 times a year.

Carol has been married to her husband Dale for nearly 44 years and has 2 sons, 3 grandchildren and 1 great-grandchild. She has lived in the Gratz area her entire life.
